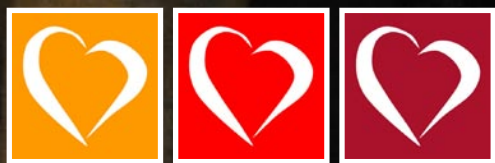

Working together with Casa Retro

Casa Retro is a company that manufactures and sells products designed to help build an education fair for children. For us, Casa Retro is a trailblazer as the first company that took our project to provide a reliable income generating activity. We created a project together so the beneficiaries of the association are packing company's product. The project that we designed with Casa Retro started in February 2009. When we met Mr Tataranu, the owner of Casa Retro, who came to visit us and brought the idea of working together.

After a long journey of trial and search for optimal solutions, we finally realized a strong collaboration. We tried different methods to see which is the best solution that persons with mental disabilities can develop a packaging activity, and which is the best working environment. Products we have to pack are different, so it's necessary to find the most efficient packing method for each product. Depending on the products they are packaging, young people need to count quantities, to make contrast shapes, sizes or colors, which is not always easy, so they need a supervisor to check each product, to lead, to correct them.

The first four months, Casa Retro products were packaged in association workshop. They worked individually formed teams were seeking to provide a quality service. Because we wanted a professional

integration of our beneficiaries in these three months, we chose a team of users who go to shop Casa Retro to pack the products there, with our employees. The efficiency of our beneficiaries at company's workshop declined, and this means that they really need to work in a protected environment, so we returned to work in our association's packaging studio. Exchange of experience who have undertaken our beneficiaries at Casa Retro has shown us that these young people in everything they do, need support, coordination and guidance, they need time and attention to give quality to their activities. Since October we have created in our center a specially designed space for our packaging products for Casa Retro. With our volunteer Marian, we were able to form teams of four young people who pack daily company's products.

The benefits of such collaborations for our association are many, so we want to point out a few of them: We were able to increase the number of beneficiaries by 30%, we varied the cluster, which brought a creativity and enthusiasm, we confirmed that November already guessed, the fact that disabled people can do different things, they just need careful coordination. What is very important is the fact that the service we offer to Casa Retro we can self-finance part of the project.

Thank you Casa Retro for their support and for the trust they gave us.



I'm Andrea (volunteer) ...

... a sociable and optimistic person who likes to enjoy every moment of life smiling. I also like foreign languages, music, dance, walks ... and especially reminding me that I can help. So, when I heard from Cristina C. about Ateliere Protejate, I wanted to do more and I decided to become a volunteer (said and done!).

At first I thought it would be very difficult for me considering that I have no training in this area. But young people have made my project much easier than I expected. They are very open, eager to learn and to make friends. They are lovely, communicative and it was easy for me to get into their little "group" (if I may say so) and make them understand that I am here to be a friend, to learn from them something, and help them as much as I can.

I've already learned so much from them, because in their souls, love seems endless. That's how you learn to see the life in a different way, you learn to appreciate yourself, with all the things you have. I believe that if we could only see the world through their eyes, just for a moment, we would understand and appreciate them as they deserve. :)

My name is Marian (volunteer) ...

... I'm 40 years old and I am the person with mobility disability since I was 9 years old. It is said that each of us has certain gifts, it's just that you have to uncover them. I consider myself "good man at all", but most of all a good driver. When I was 21 I got my driving license and then I can say that my life has just begun. The car is my mode of travel, I've changed many cars and I've made hundreds of thousands of kilometers, even participating in automobile competitions winning the first places.

I've handled myself financially, just as in life. I have founded a family and now I have a 7 years old girl, named Denisa-Emanuela.

Two years ago, I made a visit to the studio, out of pure curiosity, seeing a television report about young people who manufactured the candles. Returning now 8 months, Cristina proposed me to come to the workshop as a volunteer. I agreed, taking it as a new challenge of my life and I enjoy it. The young people here understand me so well, like we know for a lifetime; the same happens with colleagues. We work and laugh together. As Rodica says, we are family.

I am Diana (beneficiary),

I am 24 years old. I have long brown hair, brown eyes, I am kind-hearted, I like to help, I am responsible when I receive tasks, I love to meet new friends and link new friendships, although I find it hard to adapt to the new. I like reading stories, tales and poems, I am passionate about cooking, I enjoy trying new recipes and especially to eat cakes made by others (usually sweets) and I like to dance.

There are four years since working at the studio and I've learned a lot during this time. If it has not been the studio I would not know to do anything, instead now I make scented candles of many colors, with my colleagues who are outstanding (in my opinion); we create everything with joy and pleasure, especially when we have order.

We work as a real „team work” with those responsible for us (Rodica, Cristina and Katy, who help us with sales of candles) to bring a ray of hope and warmth in people's homes.

We are as a family with a big heart and all people from here are important in our lives. If one of us would go, my suffering would be great!



I am Claudiu (beneficiary),

I'm a cheerful young man, I like to joke and laugh, I am a helpful person, I enjoy helping my mother in household chores and I like to build puzzles.

Most free time I spend in the park, I like walking Herastrau long lakeside. On rainy days, the time spent in the house is not in vain; or listen to music or watch my favorite show performed by Radu Moraru, whether I play on the computer.

My work in the workshop begins at 8:00 am, although I leave home an hour earlier. My first operation is to clean molds, I make wicks, I treat them and then pour wax into molds prepared by me before.

I like to help my colleagues at the workshop tasks. Besides manufacturing candles, I still do general cleaning on Friday, I help in the kitchen, cooking when my turn comes, I do shopping, I help preparing tea, wash the dishes and jugs. Thursdays during free activities, I spend my time playing with my colleagues „Brother, no offense!”, „Wheel of Fortune”, learning to sew the fabric or to put buttons on the shirt and play outside „Flower, flower open up” or other games.



Anti-Mosquito Candles

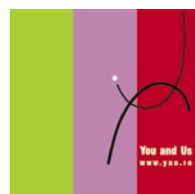
Isn't it true that, during the summer, heat and mosquitoes are a problem for you?
