Working with Kern-Liebers

Kern-Liebers is a company which develops the industry of consumer goods and produces textile and auto system products. This german company is an international manufacturer and has enterprises in several countries, in Romania also.

One of the Romanians factories is in Popesti-Leordeni where needles and accessories for weaving machines are produced. Our connection with this factory is a contract that we signed with them. We put the weaving needles on a bolster and they pay us for this. Because it is a good thing for them to know the origin of our activities and for us to better understand the production process, we visited the factory in Popesti Leordeni. The managers explained us every step of the needle production. The workers welcomed us with open heart and answered all the questions (and they weren't few) those who know the young people from 'Ateleire Protejate' know what I am talking about.

The noise, the smell of oil, the machines that were producing the needles and the working environment fascinated our youngsters. It was the first time they had contact with a factory. Although a lot of time has passed since our visit, our youngsters are still impressed by what they saw. The activity that we started proves one more time our belief that people with disabilities are able to do activities in the work field but, of course, in their own rhythm. The money that we receive for our work do not cover all the expenses but it is something and the most important thing is that our young people are the ones that make this money. The advantages of this type of contract are remarkable: the young people have a constant activity, we receive money for our work, we don't need raw material and it isn't necessary to look for clients.

Our young people are very serious and responsible when they work for Kern-Lieber and this is another proof, as I said before, that people with disabilities can have a place in society, can aspire to independence but only when the society offers them this chance.

In the end I would like to thank one more time the CEO of the company, Mr. Späth for his trust in "Ateliere Protejate" Association.
